A tendril climber with Red, White or Pink flowers.

## Benefits

A climber that will grow almost anywhere, up walls, arches, pergolas, etc. Long lasting, heavily scented flowers, which make a good cut flower.

## Story

Known commonly as the Everlasting Sweet Pea, and botanically as Lathyrus, it was first found in a Sicilian Monastery in 1695, and became very popular in England in the 1880's.
