End of May to June

Features

Deep purple flowers in late Spring/early Summer, with traditional lupin foliage.

Benefits

Strong growth making it ideal for a herbaceous border, or the back of a mixed border. Little need to stake them. Striking purple colour with hints of red at the heart of the flower.

Story

A selection made in 2002, by Sarah Conibear of West Country Lupins. It was placed into Tissue Culture in 2005 to increase numbers, so it could be introduced to the market quickly.

Plant type

Perennial

Flowers

Tall spikes of deep purple flowers in late Spring

Height after 4 years

80 - 90cm (2.5 - 3')

Spread after 4 years

50 - 60 cm (1.5 - 2')

Position

Sun or semi shade, in well drained soil

Hardiness

Hardy to -10°C
